

Installing the keyboard

Copy the keyboard bundle, Greek Antioch (US).bundle, into the appropriate folder. On a standalone computer, choose the Keyboard Layouts sub-folder of the Library folder in your home folder. If this folder doesn't exist, make one. Note that the name must be exactly this, with a space between the two words.

On a computer which has several users, the above method will make the keyboard available only to you. If you want to make the layout available to all users, copy the bundle into the Keyboard Layouts sub-folder of the Library folder at the top level of your start-up disk. Again, create the folder if it doesn't already exist.

If you are on a server, and you want to make the keyboard layout available to all users on the network, copy the bundle into the Keyboard Layouts sub-folder of the Library folder in the Network folder at the top level.

After copying the file, log out and log in again, or restart the computer. Click on the national flag at the top of the screen and select Go to Language & Text, or open the Language & Text pane of System Preferences (Keyboard on Mavericks and later systems, International on Leopard and earlier systems). On the Input Sources tab (Input Menu in Leopard and earlier), your new keyboard layout should be listed, with a big red alpha as its icon. You may need to scroll down to find it. Click the check box next to it to make it active. On Mavericks, you need to click the + button at the bottom of the list to add your keyboard layout from the list that appears. Close this window.

Now, when you click on the national flag at the top of the screen, you will be able to select your keyboard from the list.

Using the keyboard

The layout is shown in the picture Greek Antioch (US) Mac.jpg. Please print this picture and use it as a guide.

The keys for diacritics are on the numeral row of the keyboard. They are typed after the letter they go on. To add several marks to a letter, type them in the order breathing - accent - iota subscript. This applies also to capitals; accents and breathings will appear to the left of the letter as normal. On capitals, whether you get an iota adscript or an iota subscript depends on the font you are using.

The underdot (on the 0 key) should be typed after all the other marks.

Some marks - tonos, macron, breve and koronis - can't be combined with other marks.

Symbols marked in green on keys are got by holding down the Alt key while pressing the key for the symbol. For example, to type koppa, hold down Alt while pressing the q key. To type capital koppa, hold down Alt while pressing Shift-q. The key for koronis, Alt-', should be typed after the letter the koronis is to go over.
